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## HITE

1:1 Hans Jost (or Joist) Hite, (Heid, Heydt, Heyt, and so on) is said to have been a wealthy nobleman of Alsace, Germany, who sold his estates and fled to Holland because of religious persecution. But the place or date of his birth hasn't been found. It has been established that he came from Strasburg, Germany, to Kingston, New York, in 1710, on his own ship, the brigantine Swift, and the schooner Friendship, bringing with him sixteen German and Dutch families as tenants for the lands he intended to acquire.

The name Jost Heite appears frequently in the records of Kingston during the seven years of his residence there. He was a fur trader. Documents from that period show that he was well-educated and a skilled penman.

By 1717, Hite and his party were settled on a large tract of land at Germantown, Pennsylvania. But some questions arose concerning the title to these holdings, so they were exchanged for land on the Schuylkill River, at the mouth of Perkiomen Creek. There Hite built a mill and introduced weaving. He bought and sold land, opened up farms, and became prominent in local affairs. Some of his transactions were with William Penn.

In 1729, Hite became interested in tales of a fabulous new land west of the mountains, called the Shenandoah Valley. It was inhabited only by Indians, and Governor Spotswood was offering great inducements to settlers. Hite purchased 40,000 acres from John and Isaac Van Meter, dated 5 August, 1731, and known as the Van Meter Grant. Terms of the agreement called for the settlement of 40 families on the land within two years. Then on 31 August, 1731, Hite and Robert McKay (or McCoy) received an order of the Governor and Council at Williamsburg to have surveyed to them 100,000 acres on the west side of the Great Mountain, on condition of locating 100 families thereon within a two year period.

On 12 June, 1734, an order of Council was made stating that Hite had made due proof of compliance with the terms of the grant, but that same year saw the beginning of litigation between Hite and Lord Fairfax over title to the land; this suit continued during Hite's lifetime, and after fifty years, was won by his heirs.

Jost settled on the Opequon River, six miles south of present-day Winchester, where the Great Road crossed that stream. He erected a stone house on the west side of the road, and also a small mill. He built a stone fort on the east side, where many neighboring families found refuge during Indian alarms.

When the Hites first came to the Valley, it was in Spottsylvania County. That Court was too remote to serve the needs of the new settlements, and Jost was in the front of a movement to secure the erection of a new County. In 1734, Orange County was organized, but again Hite pressed for a Court to be located in his settlements. So in 1742, Frederick County Court was organized at Winchester. In 1772, Shenandoah County (originally called Dunmore) was formed, and included some of the Hite family.

Jost married, first, in Holland, Anna Maria Du Bois; died 1738; daughter of Louis Du Bois, a French Huguenot and refugee to Holland from Wicres, and a descendant of Macquaire Du Bois, Count De Roussy, A. D. 1110. Jost married, second, 1741 (or 1745), Maria Magdalena ( ) Nuschwanger, widow of Christian.



George Bowman, Paul Froman and Jacob Chrisman, the Hite sons-in-law, were allowed to select the sites for their homesteads from the original tracts, and Jost gave them deeds or grants for the land.

Jost died in 1760; his will, made 25 April, 1758, was recorded in 1761, in Frederick County, Winchester, Virginia:

..... Item: I Give and Devise To my Sons, John Hite, Jacob Hite, Isaac Hite, Abraham Hite, And to the Heirs of my Son Joseph Hite Deceased (Viz) John Hite, William Hite and Ann Hite, Sons and Daughter of my Said Deceased Son, All my Estate, both Real and Personal, of whatsoever Nature or Quality, and to their Heirs and assigns For Ever, To be Equally Divided betwixt them as Soon as may be after my Decease ..... I appoint and Constitute my Sons, John Jacob Isaac and Abraham Hite, my Executors of this my last Will and Testament .....

#### SECOND GENERATION

H2:2 Mary Hite (Jost Hite H1:1); born before the Hites arrived in New York in 1710; married about 1730, in Pennsylvania, George Bowman, a German. George and Mary were members of the Hite colony that migrated from Pennsylvania to the Shenandoah Valley. George chose a tract of land near the mouth of Cedar Creek, and established a home there. Between 1751 and 1755, he built a substantial stone house. As early as 1753, George had a mill on Cedar Creek. George Bowman, Sr, made his will 3 November, 1764, recorded Frederick County, Virginia, Will Book No. 3, pages 431-434.

"In the Name of God Amen I George Bowman of the County of Frederick, being of Sound & perfect mind & memory thanks be to God for it Do this day make & publish this my Last Will & Testament in manner & form following Vizt:

IMPRIMIS: I give and bequeath to my well beloved Wife Mary Bowman One full Third part of my moveable Estate.

ITEM: I also give and bequeath to my Said Beloved Wife Mary the Negroe fellow Harry and the Negroe Wench Esther and their Increase her Natural Life and after her Decease my Will & Desire is that the said Negroe and Esther with their increase be Appraised & Sold & the money Arising by Such Sale to be Equally Divided Between my Children which are then Living.

ITEM: I give and Bequeath unto my son Jacob Bowman the Tract of Land which I bought of William Linewell Containing Five Hundred Acres Lying and being on Linewells Creek in the County of Augusta .....

ITEM: I give and Bequeath to my Son John Bowman the Tract of Land Which I



Bought of Jost Hite Containing Five Hundred Acres Lying and being on the said Linewells Creek.....

ITEM: I give and Bequeath to my Son Abraham Bowman One Hundred & Fifty Pounds Current money Two Horses or Mares of the Value of Ten Pounds.....

ITEM: I give and Bequeath unto my Son Joseph Bowman One Hundred & Fifty Pounds Current Money Two Horses or Mares of the Value of Ten Pounds each.....

ITEM: my will & Desire is that the Tract of Land & Plantation Whereon I now Live which Contains Seven Hundred & Twenty Acres be Divided in four Equal parts which I give & bequeath in manner following Vizt: the House and Plantation with the Land Joining thereto according to the Division I give to my Son Isaac to be by him Possessed when he comes of Age with this Reserve only, That it is my Will & Desire that my Well beloved Wife Mary, Shall Live thereon and enjoy the same During her Natural Life, that part of the Said Tract whereon the Mill is, I give to my Son George together with the Mill According to the said Division. That Part of the said Tract Joining the Plantation According to the sd. Division I give to my Son Abraham, And the other Remaining part I give to my Son Joseph to be by them Possessed when the(y) Come to Age.

ITEM: I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Stephens One Hundred Pounds Current Money.

ITEM: I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Ruddle One Hundred Pounds Current Money.

ITEM: I give and Bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Right One Hundred Pounds Current Money.

ITEM: I give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Reganer Dyeller One Hundred Pounds Current Money.

ITEM: I give and Bequeath to my Daughter Rebecca Bowman One Hundred Pounds Current Money Three Cows & Calves one Heifer Six Sheep and one Horse or Mare of the Value of Ten Pounds.

It is my will & Desire also is that the Tract of Land Containing Three Hundred & twenty Acres lying on Crooked Run in this County, The Tract of Land Containing one Hundred Acres Lying on the North River of Sharrando and the House and Half Lott of Ground in the Town of Winchester together with the out Lott belonging to the Same be sold by my Said Executors to the best Advantage Given..... the money Arising thereby Together with the money Arising by the sale of the Rest & Residue of my Estate both Real & Personal not heretofore mentioned Be Divided Equally between my Beloved Wife Mary and the surviving part of my Children.

And further I Constitute & Appoint my sons Jacob and George Bowman and my Son in Law Isaac Ruddle Executors of this my Last Will & Testament.....

H2:3 John Hite (Jost Hite H1:1); some sources say he was born 1710, but no proof has been given. John erected, in the 1750s, a fine Colonial house, "Springdale", near Red Bud on the Opequon. In 1787 he built the first brick house west of the Blue Ridge. He was a Vestryman in Christ's Episcopal Church, Winchester. He was prominent in civil affairs, holding several local offices, and was a Colonel of the Frederick County Militia, distinguished for his bravery during the Indian Wars.

## CHRISMAN

Cl:1 Jacob Chrisman I; born in Germany, probably between 1700 and 1710; died about 1778; married (1) around 1729, Pennsylvania, Magdalene Hite (H2:2); married (2) about 1770, Mary, died 1782. Some researchers believe that the second wife was Mary Niswanger, daughter of Christian and Mary Magdalena Niswanger; the widow Mary Magdalena Niswanger became the second wife of Jost Hite.

Public Record Office; Chancery Lane, London, WC2A; Virginia Records: At a General Court held at the Capitol October 23rd, 1745, Jacob Christman a Native of the City of Worms in Germany, who has resided in this Colony upwards of seven years last past and has not been absent out of the same the space of two months at any one time came into Court .... and produced a Certificate of his having received the Sacrament of the Lords Supper according to the Act of Parliament .... and then took and subscribed the Oaths appointed .... and subscribed the Declaration thereby appointed in order to his being Naturalized.

Jacob and Magdalene were with the Hite emigrant train when it left Pennsylvania about 1730. When they arrived in the Valley, Jacob selected a tract of 750 acres lying about two and a half miles south of the present Stephens City; the grant was recorded 14 May, 1740, in Orange County, Virginia. References in an old deed describe this land as "grass land, prairie", and Jacob purchased from George Bowman "some acres out of his large timber". Here Jacob made his home, near a cluster of never-failing springs, which are still known as Chrisman's Springs. In 1751, Jacob built a stone house which is still standing.

There was an old German custom, called seizin, or seisin. It involved the transfer of title of possessions to another generation, and was symbolized by the passing of a pewter dish, in the presence of a number of witnesses; the ceremonial conveyance was an inviolable rite. The purpose was to permit the executors of a will to act freely and without obtaining a number of signatures for each act; Jacob executed such a deed, transferring all his property except real estate. It is recorded in Deed Book 17, page 372, Frederick County, Virginia:

"KNOW all men by these presents that I, Jacob Christman of the County of Frederick in the Commonwealth of Virginia in consideration of the natural love and affection which I have and bear to my sons George Christman and Henry Christman and also for divers good causes and considerations, me the said Jacob Christman hereunto moving have given granted and confirmed and by these presents do give grant and confirm unto the said George Christman and Henry Christman all and singular my slaves, goods, chattles, ready money and personal estate whatsoever in whose hands custody or possession so ever they be within the thirteen United States of America, to have, hold and enjoy all and singular the said slaves, goods, chattles, ready money and personal estate aforesaid unto the said George Christman and Henry Christman, their executors, administrators and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of the said George Christman and Henry Christman, their executors, administrators, and assigns forever.

AND I, the said Jacob Christman, an all and singular the said slaves, goods, chattles, ready money and personal estate and other the premises to the said George Christman and Henry Christman, their executors, administrators, and assigns against me the said Jacob Christman, my executors, administrators and all and every other person or persons whatsoever shall and will warrant and defend by these presents of all and singular which said slaves, good, chattles, ready money and personal estate and other the premises, I, the said Jacob Christman have put the said George Christman and Henry Christman in full possession by

delivering to them one pewter dish at the time of sealing and delivering of these presents in the name of the whole premises hereby granted.

IN WITNESS whereof I, the said Jacob Christman have hereunto set my hand seal the eighth day of August one thousand seven hundred and seventy seven.

At a Court held for Frederick County the 7th day of October, 1777 this deed of gifts was proved by the oaths of John Emitt, John Taylor, Joseph Stevens and Peter Opp, witnesses whereto and ordered to be recorded.

After the seizin ceremony was completed, Jacob made his will on 6 September, 1777; it is recorded in Will Book 4, page 402, Frederick County, Virginia:

"..... ITEM: I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Christman, one feather bed and furniture to her and to her heirs and assigns forever.

ITEM: I give and bequeath to my well beloved sons Jacob Christman, Abraham Christman, George Christman and Henry Christman, the sum of sixty pounds to each of them and to the heirs and assigns forever.

ITEM: I give and bequeath unto my daughter-in-law Elizabeth Broughton the sum of one shilling sterling to her and to her heirs and assigns forever.

ITEM: I give and bequeath unto my well beloved daughter Rebecca Scott, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds during her natural life and at her dicease I give and bequeath the above said sum of one hundred and fifty pounds to my granddaughter Mary Christman, daughter of my said daughter Rebecca Scott to her and to her heirs and assigns forever.

ITEM: I give and bequeath unto my well beloved children Jacob Christman, Abraham Christman, and to my son Isaac Christman, his children to the four sons of my son John Christman, George Christman and Henry Christman, daughter Sarah Barley, and to my daughter MaryStephens her children and to the children of my daughter Goudy, the plantation whereon I now live and all my real and personal estate to be sold and equally divided among them and to their heirs and assigns forever.

AND LASTLY ..... do hereby appoint my trusty and beloved sons George Christman and Henry Christman, executors of this my last will and testament .....

A tract containing three hundred ninety-four acres of Jacob's land was sold to James Sutor, and on 4 April, 1804, the Court approved the account of George Chrisman, executor of the estate of Jacob Chrisman. The account was long and involved; it not only named the children and many of the grandchildren, it also indicated that Jacob and his family had lived very comfortably. (Will Book 7; pages 220-224; Frederick County, Virginia)

James Sutor defaulted on the land payment, and George Chrisman, surviving executor, filed suit. The Court appointed three Commissioners, Richard P. Barton, James Singleton, and Samuel Kercheval, to sell the land at public auction. The tract was purchased by Joseph Stover for the sum of £ 1212, a princely amount for that time. (Superior Court Book 5; page 351; Frederick County, Virginia)

C2:2 Jacob Chrisman II (Jacob Chrisman C1:1); b 1730; d 28 Apr, 1809; m Magdalina \_\_\_\_\_; b 1732; d 4 Feb, 1809; both buried on a high ridge east of Lost City, Hardy County, West Virginia. No record has been found of Jacob's marriage; a family traditions says that Magdalina was a Hite, Jacob's cousin.

On the 6th day of September, 1753, Jacob Chrisman, Jr, received a patent for 400 acres of land in Frederick County, Virginia, signed by Lord Fairfax; this land had been surveyed by George Washington. Terms of the grant called for the yearly payment of one shilling sterling for each 50 acres, due on the feast day of St. Michael the Archangel. Jacob sold the land 9 May, 1763, to his brother-in-law, Thomas Sperry. (Deed says Perry)



The following is from an article "History of Lost River Community", (Hardy Co, W. Va.) by F. B. Chrisman, 1925, published by the Agricultural Extension Division, Morgantown, West Virginia:

".....Captain Jacob Chrisman ..... with several other men followed a band of Indians who had killed some settlers of the Shenandoah Valley and taken some prisoners across the North Mountain. Arriving at Rock Bridge, now the state boundary on North Mountain, after dark, Captain Chrisman sighted the Indians' camp fire near the top of Branch Mountain and came to their camp just before dawn. He surprised them and after killing three of their number and recovering the prisoners, returned to this valley and decided to take a lease which he did in 1753. The patent calls for a tract of 425 acres of land on Lost River of Cacapon patented to Jacob Chrisman, Jr, by Lord Fairfax, September 13, 1753..... ..

There is no record of a Jacob Chrisman bearing arms during the Revolution, but the name does appear in civilian service records for Hampshire County, (West) Virginia. On 12 September, 1783, Jacob was paid £ 1 11/3d for 125 pounds of beef furnished to the Army. On 17 December, 1783, Jacob was reimbursed £ 8 10/8d for a horse furnished to McAfee's Brigade; the horse was lost. (Virginia State Library, Revolutionary War Public Service Claims Commissioners, Books III and IV)

From Last Will and Testament of Jacob Chrisman; Hardy County Will Book; page 382:

I allow my shop tools and desk to be sold and the money ..... to be equally divided between my three sons.

ITEM: I give and bequeath to my well beloved son-in-law, Thomas Littler 15 pounds to be paid out of my estate and after the said Legisees be paid to the said Legeties I allow all my money, Bonds, bills notes and open accounts to be equally divided among my well beloved sons and daughters. I likewise Constitute, make and ordain my well-beloved son Isaac Chrisman and Samel Branson Executors ..... this thirtyeth day of December in the year One Thousand Seven Hundred and ninety seven.

## GOCHENOUR

G1:1 Among the early settlers of the Shenandoah Valley in Virginia were two families by the name of Gochenour. The name was spelled a score or more of ways in the various records. Jacob Gochenour and Henry Gochenour were probably related, but no proof of this has been found. Neither has it been established that the two men were immigrants, but it is generally thought that they were.

Henry first appeared in the County records 26 January, 1747, when he was a witness to John Hachman's will (Augusta County Will Book 1, page 95). Henry obtained a land grant of 300 acres on 20 October, 1750 "on the north side of Narrow Passage" near St. Luke (Northern Neck Land Book G, page 461). This is about two and one half miles from the original land grant of Jacob Gochenour. On 4 March, 1755, Henry acquired 150 additional acres (NN Land Book H, page 618).

Henry died in 1788. Barbara Gochenour, presumably Henry's widow, and son Henry, Jr. were named administrators of the estate (Shenandoah County Will Book O, page 467). The sale of personal property was held 14 February, 1789.

From Shenandoah County Deed Book I, page 587: ..... Henry Gochenour and Elizabeth his wife; Jacob Gochenour and Susan his wife; the Said Henry and Jacob being sons and heirs of Henry Gochenour, late of Shenandoah County deceased; Henry Rader and Elizabeth his wife; John Zimmerman Junr. and Barbara his wife; Adam Rader and Ann his wife; the said Elizabeth, Barbara and Ann being daughters and heirs of the said Henry Gochenour; Nicholas Rader and Magdalene, his wife; the said Magdalene being also a daughter and heir of the said Henry Gochenour, deceased; to Joseph Gochenour who is also a son and heir of Henry Gochenour, deceased .....

8 November, 1828, Henry Gochenour, Jr, administrator, filed an account of the final distribution, and it included a share paid to Rachel Romick. Henry also paid to Jacob the shares of David and John.

This was accepted and recorded by the Court as Henry's Last Will and Testament; it is presumed that Henry disinherited Ann because of the illegitimate son. Henry's son Jacob filed suit as next best friend of Daniel Gochenour, minor child of Ann Gochenour. The Court set aside the will, and made equal distribution to six children. Henry III didn't receive a share of the real estate, as he had been given land before his father's death. The other children made small payments to Henry to equalize his share. The widow, Mary, received two shares as her dower. Samuel Gochenour was the administrator. The surveyor made the division of property 24 February, 1834, but the report of the Commissioners wasn't recorded until 2 May, 1842 (Hardy County Deed Book 17, page 51). Henry owned a large amount of property, both real and personal; sale receipts in the estate file show that he was a slaveholder.

Jacob probably moved with his father to Hardy County in 1815. He purchased land there in 1829, 1830, 1834 and 1835.

In 1844, Jacob was imprisoned for non-payment of debts. He was engaged in buying up undistributed shares of estates in which the landowner had died intestate. This practice was quite common then; settlement of such an estate could take years, and there were usually some of the heirs who were in a hurry to get their money. There are no records of any transactions between Jacob and the Harpers, but he must have acted as an agent for them, or borrowed money from them and over-extended himself. He apparently had foreseen the debacle, as he tried in 1843 to protect himself by deeding land to sons, and putting his personal property in trust. Jacob signed the following Insolvent Debtors Oath, and was released from prison:

From Deed Book 18, page 150; Hardy County, West Virginia: This indenture made this 1st day of April 1844, between Jacob Gouchenour of the one part and the Sheriff of Hardy County of the other part. Witnesseth that whereas the said Jacob Gouchenour is now in the custody of the Sheriff of said county by virtue of an execution issued out of the Clerk's Office of the Circuit Super-



ior Court of Law and Chancery for Mary County, by George and Samuel Harper, against him, and whereas the said Gochenour is about to discharge himself from such custody by taking the oath prescribed for the relief of insolvent debtors, and whereas he has surrendered in this schedule his interest in a tract of land lying in Thorn Bottom containing twenty acres, also an account against Daniel Funkhouser for twelve dollars.

Also his interest in the following property subject to a deed of trust executed to Moses Wilson for the benefit of Eli Lasher, Henry Gochenour, Jr, Jeremiah Innskeep and William Branson on the 4th day of March 1843, to-wit:

"One horse, one cow, two small cattle, ten sheep, nineteen hogs, all his household and kitchen furniture, one waggon, one set blacksmith tools, one stove, three ploughs, one harrow, three pr. gear, one wheat fan, one cutting box, three forks, one shovel, three hones, three mat-tocks and four axes."

Also all his right, title and interest in and to a tract of land lying in the County of Hardy on the Great Capon, which he heretofore conveyed to his son Joseph Gochenour by deed executed the 1st day of March 1843 - also all his right, title and interest in and to another tract of land in said County of Hardy lying in Thorn Bottom, which he also heretofore conveyed to son Henry Gochenour by deed executed the 1st of March 1843. Whereas he is advised that said conveyances are void as to creditors having debts at the date of said deeds, he therefore conveys to the sheriff all his right, title and interest in and to the said tracts of land, Therefore the said Gouchenour for and in consideration of said premises does hereby grant, bargain and convey to the said Sheriff of Hardy County all interest, claims and demand whatsoever either in law or equity of him the said Jacob Gouchenour, and his heirs, of, in and to the said property, with its appurtenances which is now accurately set forth, together with all and singular the rents, issues and profits thereof - to have and to hold the same with its appurtenances to the said Sheriff in conformity with the law in such cases provided free from all claims of his the said Jacob Gouchenour and his heirs forever. In witness whereof the said Gouchenour has hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal this day and year first herein before written.

/s/ JACOB GOCHANOUR (seal)

Henry and Joseph did not surrender the land deeded to them, so they either satisfied the debts, or won clear title through the Court; no record of such action has been found.

In the 1860 Census, Jacob was living with his son Henry. No date has been found for Jacob's death, but it was probably between 1860 and 1870.

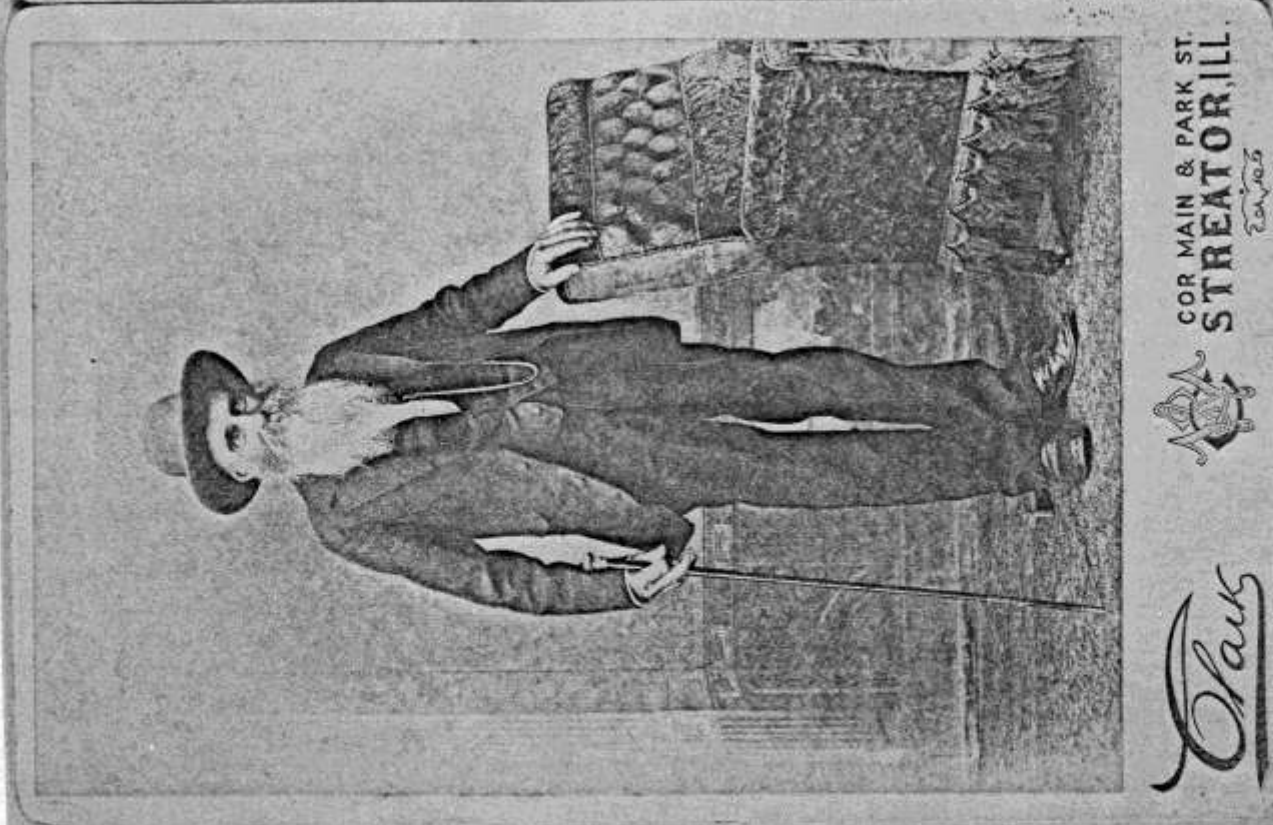

William H. told his grandchildren that their first home in Illinois was a teepee. In 1850, they moved to Section 22 of Bruce Township. Later Jonathan C. sold that land, and purchased a farm in Section 10, Otter Creek Township. He was a farmer and carpenter. He served as tax collector and was a constable for several years.

A family legend says that two sons of Jonathan and Lucy quarreled with their parents, and subsequently broke all connections with the family; they later married Indian girls. *Error: They were Jonathan's brothers*

Jonathan C. and his brother Mort changed the spelling of their name from Gochenour to Gochanour. It remains that way in these families, while other branches still use an "e".

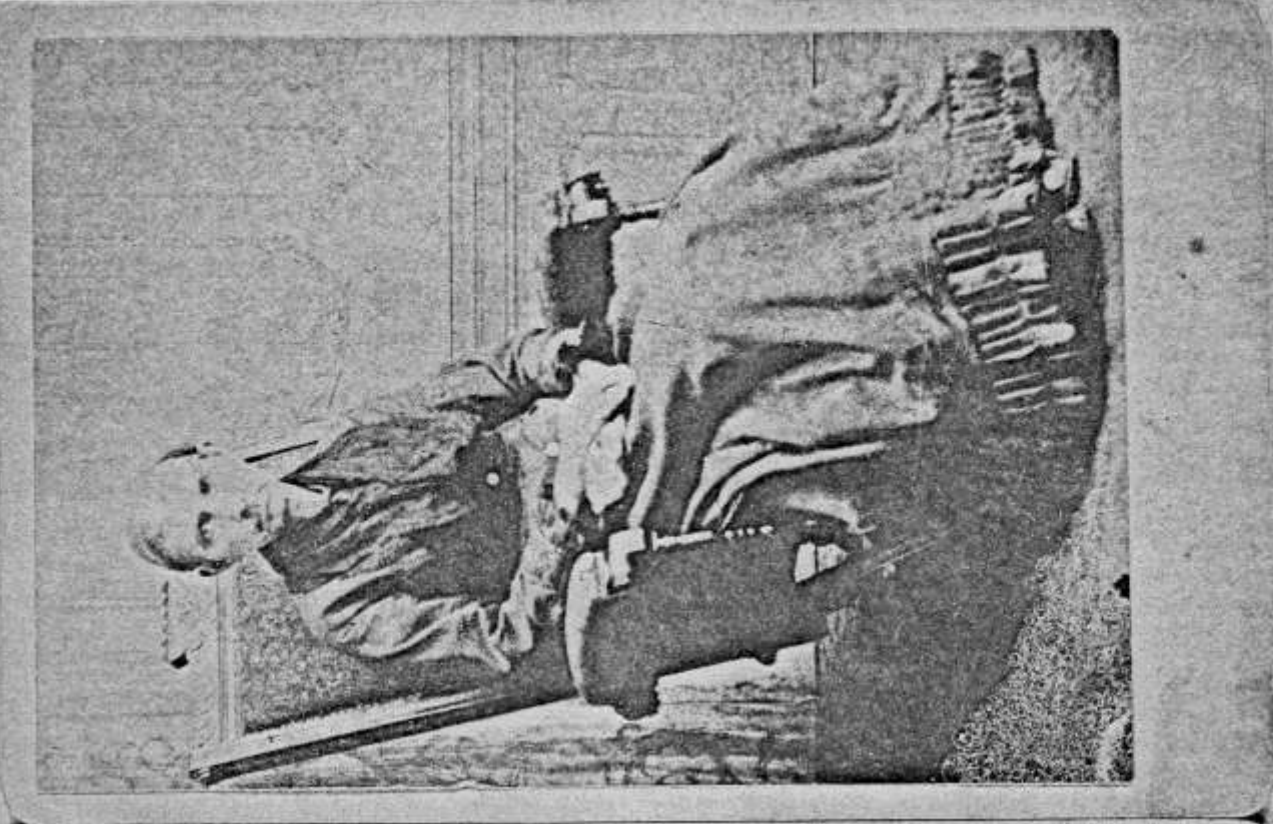

From Past and Present of La Salle County; 1910:

"..... Soon after his marriage Mr. Gochanour began farming on his own account, having first purchased 60 acres of land. He turned his attention to the raising of sugar cane and engaged that business for 42 years, having made during this time 200,000 gallons of syrup. In 1870 and again in 1885 he sent to the agricultural department at Washington, D. C. a sample of his syrup and the report of this department showed that his product was the best made in the United States. He always used the Cook evaporator in making his goods and his processes were in accord with the latest improved methods. As the years have gone by he has made judicious investment in property and is now the owner of 360 acres of valuable farming land -240 acres in Illinois, and 120 acres in Iowa- which he has placed under a high state of cultivation and to which he has added many modern improvements. Since his retirement from active business his sons operate the farm. He also has an extensive apiary and has found the culture of bees to be not only profitable but pleasant as well. This work had received close attention from him and he had made a study of the subject in order to secure the best plans for handling the bees and the product of the hive. He is well known as a bee culturist and in addition to his varied interests on the farm he owns a fine business block in Letts, Louisa County, Iowa, with a plate glass front of 95 feet."

Eunice McDevitt Unger contributed the following:

My Mother, Nola, remembers her Grandfather and Grandmother Gochanour. She says Angus was an extremely handsome man with very regular, finely chiseled features, whose looks reminded her of a Greek god. She remembers Eva as a big raw-boned woman, blunt and tactless. Nola remembers walking home from school one day with a little neighbor boy and as they passed the bank, he remarked, "My Dad says that your Grandpa owns half that bank".

Angus was living in the Victoria Hotel in Anita in 1927. He had been in poor health for some time, and finally was taken to the Atlantic hospital where he died. He didn't leave a will; there was a sizeable estate, but he apparently hadn't paid his bills for years. The heirs wrangled among themselves, and then filed an objection to the first report of the administrators. When it was all finally settled, and the administrators and lawyers paid, the heirs received less than \$1000 each.

Earl and Cecil eloped when he was 18 and she was 16. Cecil's father was opposed to the marriage, but her Mother helped them to slip away. It was a poor match, and they didn't get along well. About 1903, they went to Washington, living in the mountains around Colville and Addy. Earl tried mining, but the family did not prosper in Washington - it just grew. By 1913 they were back in Anita with five children. That didn't work, either; they went back to Washington, and Earl decided to join some homesteaders in Alberta. But he wasn't a homesteader or farmer, either. A relative recalls Earl sitting surveying the barren prairie and saying, "Here I visualize a huge peach orchard", but alas, no peach orchard materialized. In 1917, Earl left his wife and family.

Cecil managed as best she could, no easy task for a woman of 34 with seven children and no education. The three oldest girls went out as "hired girls" at an early age, and married young. Cecil stayed in Alberta until 1939, when the boys went to Seattle to engage in war work. Shortly after that Harley was stricken with a creeping paralysis. His mother nursed him faithfully until his death in 1953. Cecil then moved to Everett, Washington, and lived out her life there. (From material furnished by Eunice McDevitt Unger)

## LARY

There are discrepancies in records of John's birth date. His obituary and grave stone inscription say that he was born in 1830. The 1850 Census gives his age as 22, and the biographical sketch found in the Cass County (Iowa) history states that he was born in 1832. In 1886, John signed an affidavit stating that he was then 52 years of age. There was just as much confusion concerning his name. Family tradition says that it was originally O'Leary. The 1850 Census and his marriage record give it as Leary. Army records list him as both Larry and Lary; the Cass County history of 1884 spells it Larry. But in 1886, John signed his name Lary, and that has been the family name since then.

The sketch in the Cass County history says that John came to America at the age of three months, and that his parents died when he was five years of age. It states that he then lived with the Samuel Milliken family. But part of the record is missing, as John was not with the Millikens in 1840; he was there in 1850.

On 19 October, 1861, at Ottawa, Illinois, John H. Larry enlisted in Company B, 53rd Regiment of Illinois Volunteers, for three years. He reenlisted 4 January, 1864. Records show that in March and April, 1864, he was on sick leave at Ottawa.

John's outfit accompanied Sherman on his famous march to the sea. On the night of 5 September, 1864, near Atlanta, Georgia, John injured his right knee, while helping to get a wagon train out of the mud. From November, 1864, through April, 1865, John was detailed to Quartermaster Department, 4th Division, 17 AC. He then returned to his outfit, and was mustered out with the Company, 22 July, 1865, at Louisville, Kentucky.

After their marriage, John and Amanda lived in La Salle County for a few years. Then in June, 1870, they came to Iowa in a covered wagon, with a cow tied behind to provide milk for their three small children. They rented a farm in Cass County for two years, then in 1872, bought 120 acres of "wild" land in Section 30, Noble Township; this was their home for the rest of their lives.

The knee which John had injured in service gave him a lot of trouble in later years; also camp fare had impaired his digestive system, and he eventually died of a stomach disorder. On 7 August, 1886, John applied for a disability pension, but the records are unclear as to whether or not he received it. After his death, Amanda applied for a pension, and it was approved. Beginning 18 Jan, 1896, she was to receive \$8 per month; she would also draw \$2 per month for each of the three youngest children, which would stop as each one reached the age of sixteen.

John died at home 31 October, 1895. The funeral service was held at the Methodist Church in Grant. According to the obituary in the Griswold American, it was a most impressive affair, with 78 carriages in the procession. When Amanda died 4 January, 1910, her six oldest sons served as pall-bearers, and the youngest one carried a floral wreath.

According to family tradition, John had an older brother who did not change his name. The brother went to Kansas or Oklahoma, and we have O'Leary relatives there.

Frank suffered from a severe case of wanderlust, and seldom stayed long in one place. At the time he and Dora eloped, Frank was working for his brother George, so they lived in the Wax community for a time. By 1898, they were living a mile and a half north of Elliott, on the Ploghoft place. At one time, they lived a short distance north and west of there, down by the river, but the date is uncertain. They went back to Wax, sometime after 1 July, 1902.

It isn't known just how long the Larys stayed in Colorado, but next they went to Vernon County, Missouri, where they lived by the Osage River; some of Dora's family were near there. They came back to Iowa about the first of 1908, and settled two miles north of Elliott. Frank was a member of the Elliott Lodge of the Knights of Pythias. They were still there the last of March, 1912. Members of the family say they then moved onto a hilltop on Swede Street, not far from the old Lary home place, but they were there a very short time, as Ruth's autograph album indicates that they were in Minnesota by the middle of August, 1912; they lived on the shore of Mille Lacs Lake, near Wahkon. The album shows that they left Wahkon the latter part of November, 1913; they returned to the hilltop on Swede Street. They were living near Sand's Hill, southwest of Griswold, during the Spanish influenza epidemic of 1918-19, when Frank nearly died. When Carl and Ray came home from World War I, the family lived about a mile west of Griswold. They moved into Griswold in 1920.

In the fall of 1925, Frank went to Washington with his daughter, Lola, and her husband. When school was out in the spring of 1926, Dora and the four youngest children went to Washington on the train. They lived at Anacortes, and Frank worked in a pulp mill. Frank enjoyed fishing in Puget Sound and one year received the diamond pin given for the largest salmon caught on a hand line. Frank and Dora moved to Bellingham, then shortly after went to a farm home five or six miles northeast of Bellingham. They moved back into Bellingham, where they celebrated their Golden Wedding anniversary on 5 July, 1944.

Will Book F. pages 470 - 474; Shenandoah County, Virginia:

IN THE NAME of God I Mathias Schmootz, Senr. of the County of Shenandoah in the State of Virginia calling to mind the certainty of death and the uncertainty when it may happen and being of Sound mind and memory do think proper to make this my Last Will and Testament which I do in the following manner.

FIRST, I Direct that all my just Debts and Funeral Expenses be paid out of my personal (estate).

SECOND I will and direct that my beloved wife Regina Smutz shall live on the Plantation I now live on during her natural life and she shall have free Possession of said House and Garden and she shall have the choice of five apple trees out of my orchard yearly & every year, during her said life time. I do further Give to my wife two beds, Bedsteads and the furniture to the same belonging and all her wearing apparel of every kind one Table whichever She Shall make choice of Three chairs and as much of the kitchen Furniture including plates Dishes knives & forks and pots as She may deem necessary for her housekeeping & the walnut cupboard the stove with pipe the clock and case standing in my house. I do also Give to my Wife Two milk cows & two Sheep whichever She may make choice of out of my Stock of Cattle at the time of my death the said Two Cows of my wife to be kept by my son Abraham Smutz on the Plantation I now live for my wife in the summer in pasture and during the (winter) to be well fed by him yearly & every year during her said life. I also direct that my two sons Abraham Schmutz & Matthias Schmutz each of them Give unto my Widow yearly & every year Seven Bushells of wheat, Three Bushells of rye three bushells of Indian Corn, Twenty five pounds Weight of Good Pork Twenty five pounds of good Stall fed beef a half Bushel of Salt the beef and Pork to be delivered to her in the fall at killing time & Seven pounds of hackled Flax I do further direct that my sons Abraham & Matthias find her a sufficient quantity of firewood cut fit for hearth & stove and hawled to her house yearly and Every year during her natural life I do further Give and unto my wife one hundred Dollars current money of the United States to be paid to her in cash by my Executors hereinafter named out of my personal estate directly after my decease. All the Above Articles Given and devised to my Wife are only for her Use during her natural life and after her death whatever may be remaining Shall be equally divided amongst my children, Share and Share alike.

THIRD, I Give to my daughter Barbara, wife of Michael Stover one Hundred Pounds current money of Virginia of which She and Her husband have already received forty two pounds the remaining £ 58 pounds to make up the £ 100.....

FOURTH, I Give to my daughter Magdalene wife of Lewis Keebler one hundred pounds current money of Virginia of which She and her husband have already received Twenty Six pounds .....

FIFTH, I Give to my daughter Elizabeth wife of henry Gochenour one hundred pounds current money of Virginia of which She and her husband have already received Forty Eight pounds .....

SIXTH, I Give to my daughter Anna wife of John Miller one hundred pounds current money of Virginia of which She and her husband have already received Forty Two pounds .....

SEVENTH, I Give to my Daughter Rosina wife of Gabriel Sager one hundred pounds of which She and her husband have already received Fifty pounds fifteen Shillings .....

EIGHTH, I Give to my daughter Mary Wife of Adam Mavis one hundred pounds current money of Virginia of which She and her husband have already received Thirty Pounds .....

NINTH, I Give & devise unto my son Abraham Smutz ..... one part of my plantation ..... conveyed to me by Christian Stover ..... bearing date the 26th & 27th days of October 1784 .....

TENTH, I give and devise to my Son Matthias Smutz ..... all the other and remaining part of my said plantation .....

.....

THIRTEENTH, I Will and direct that all my personal estate already herein devised Shall as soon as conveniently may be after my death be appraised & sold at Public Sale & the money arising of Such Sale Shall be equally divided among my Eight children .....

LASTLY, I do hereby constitute my two sons Abraham Smutz and Matthias Smutz Executors ..... In Witness whereby I have hereunto Set my hand & seal the 24th day of June in the year of our Lord 1800.

From "Annals of Augusta County, Virginia; 1726-1871", by J. A. Wadell, 1902; pg 37:

"John McDowell migrated with his wife Magdalena, his son Samuel, and his servant John Rutter, from Great Britain to Orange County, Virginia in 1737."

John Rutter was probably our Ritter ancestor, but I haven't had time to trace the connection.

Stephen and his family appear in the Licking County Census for 1840 and 1850, but not in 1860. The 1870 Census for Stephen Jr. shows that some of his children were born in Illinois between 1858 and 1862; perhaps Stephen and Mary were also in Illinois.

Stephen died intestate, and no record has been found naming his children. A tentative list has been compiled, chiefly from Census records, but it may be inaccurate and incomplete.
